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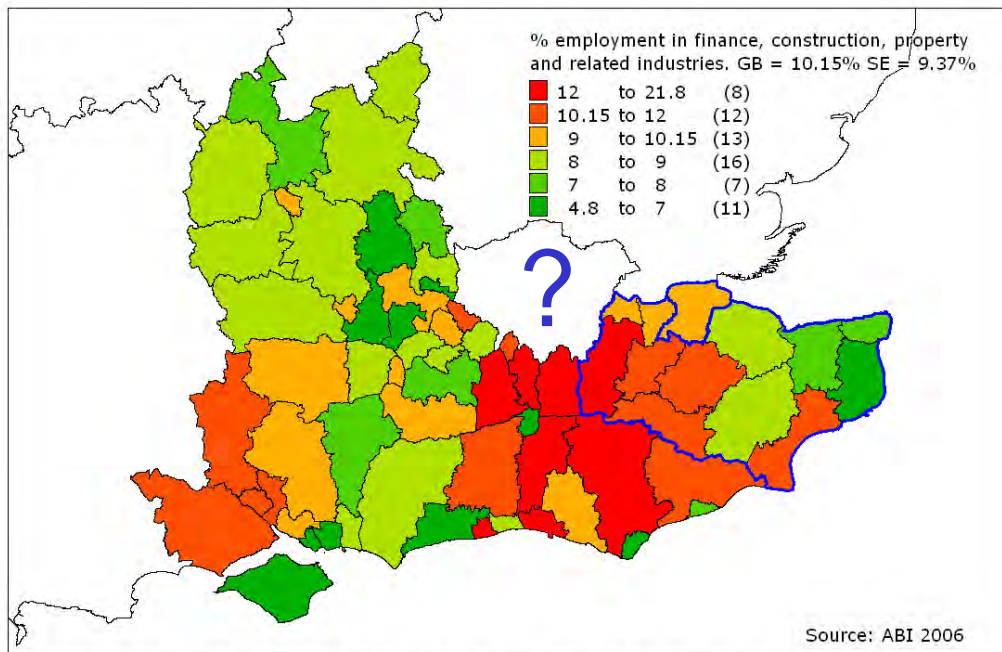

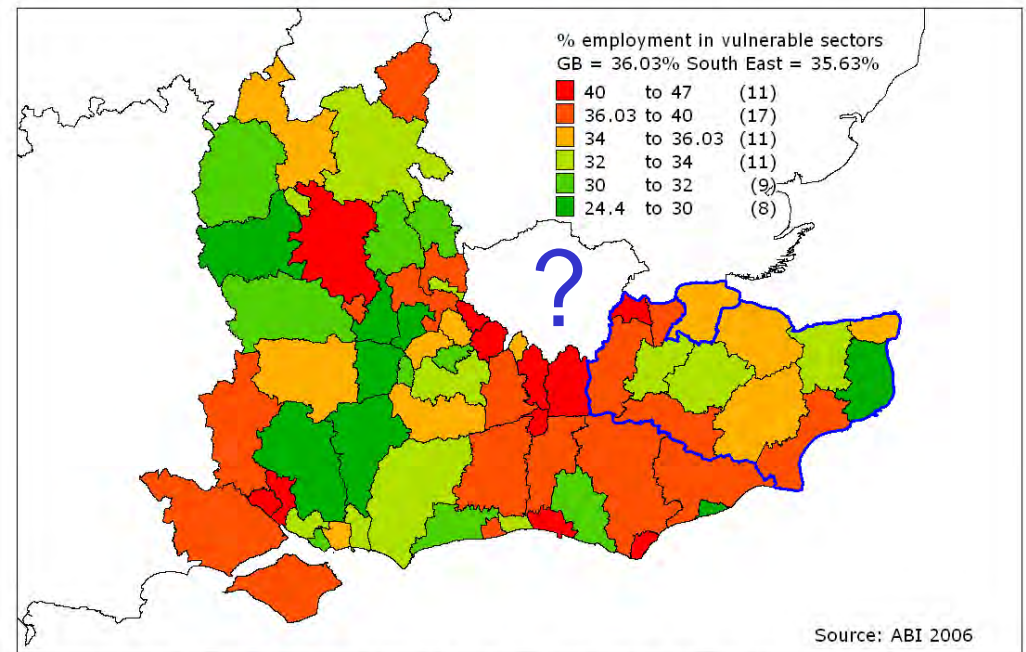
From Credit Crunch to Economic Downturn: Sectoral Distribution

% of employment in sectors exposed to credit crunch and consumer spending



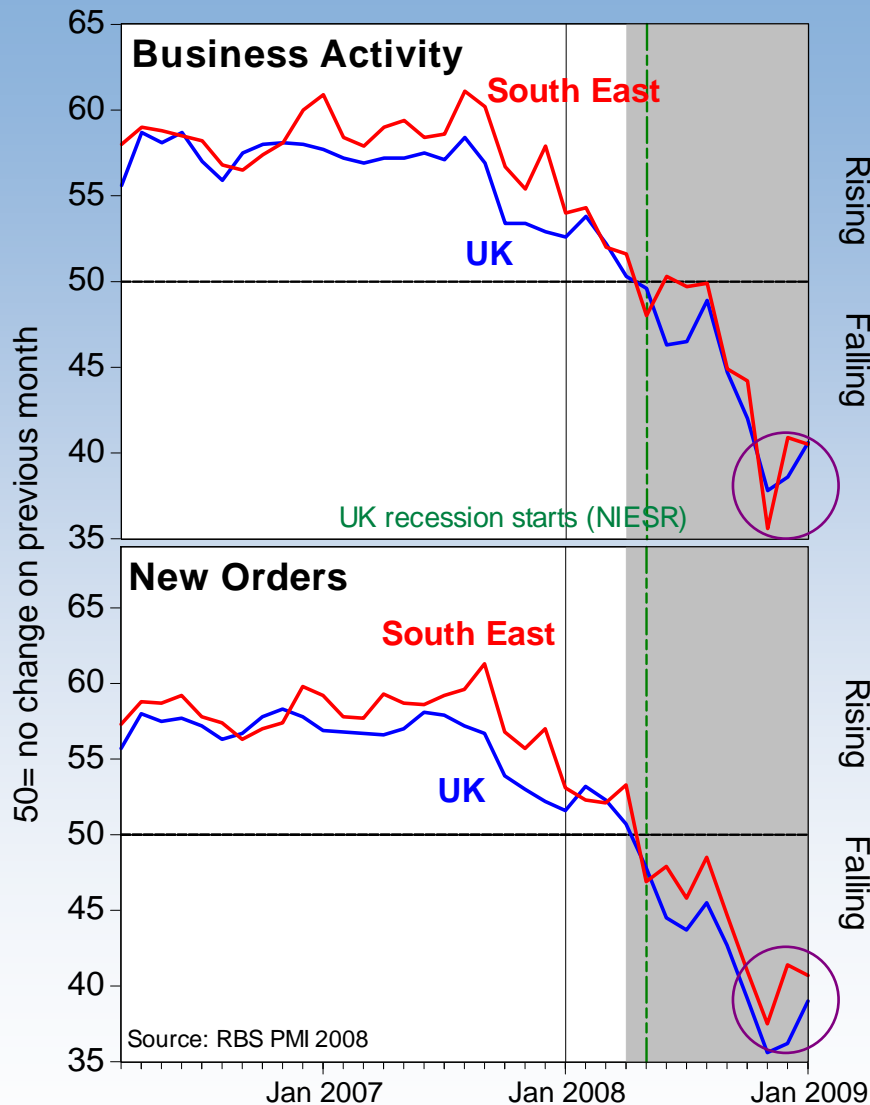
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South East - Falling Business Activity



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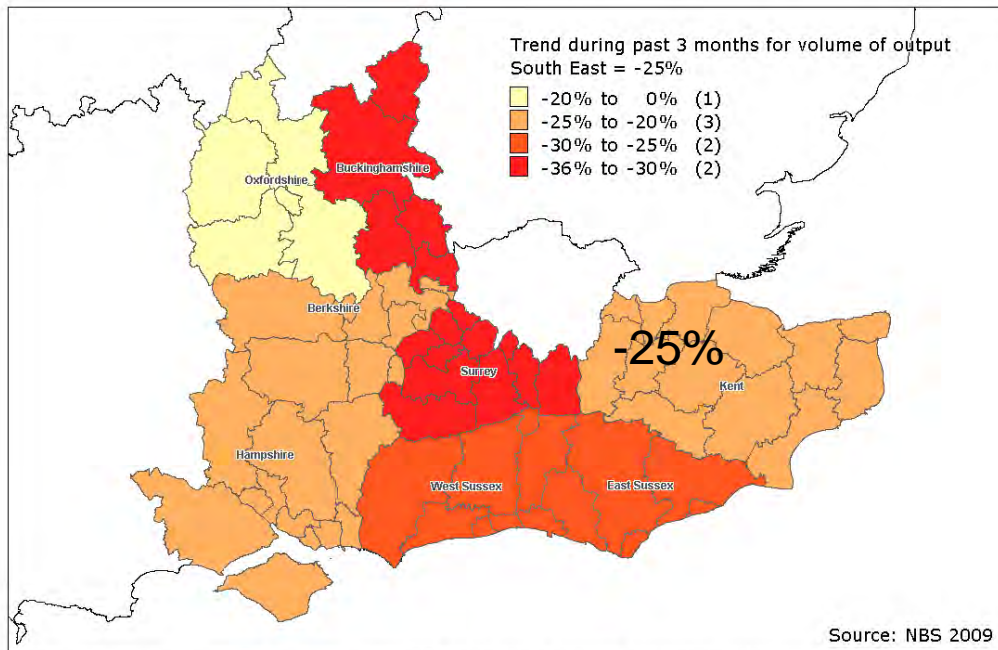
- Rate of decline has slowed down?

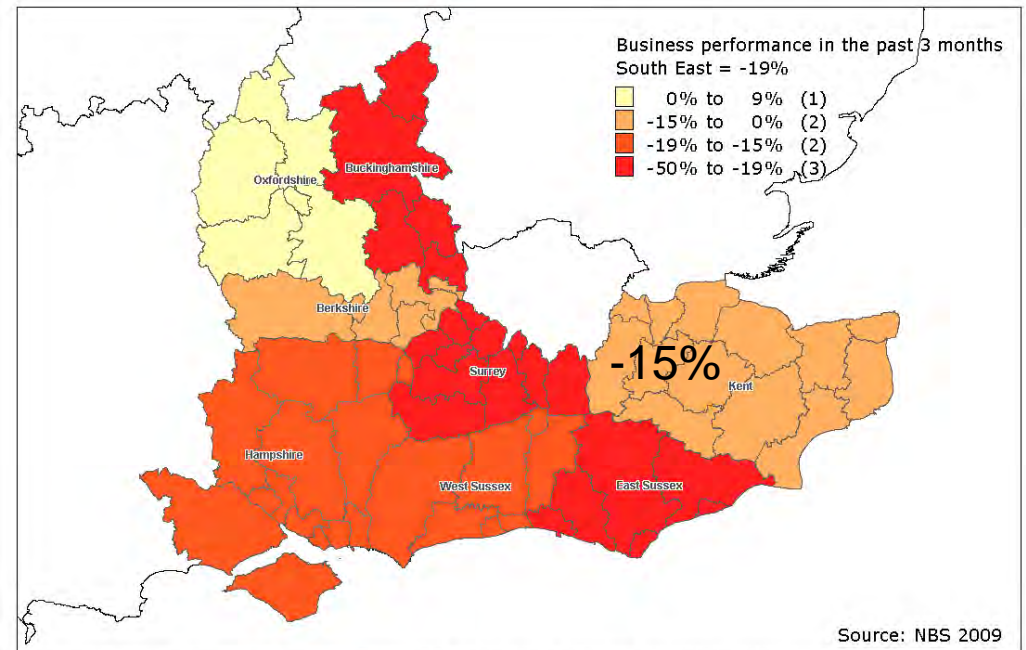
Businesses in Kent did better than in most other counties

... Business Performance in the past 3 months (net balance)



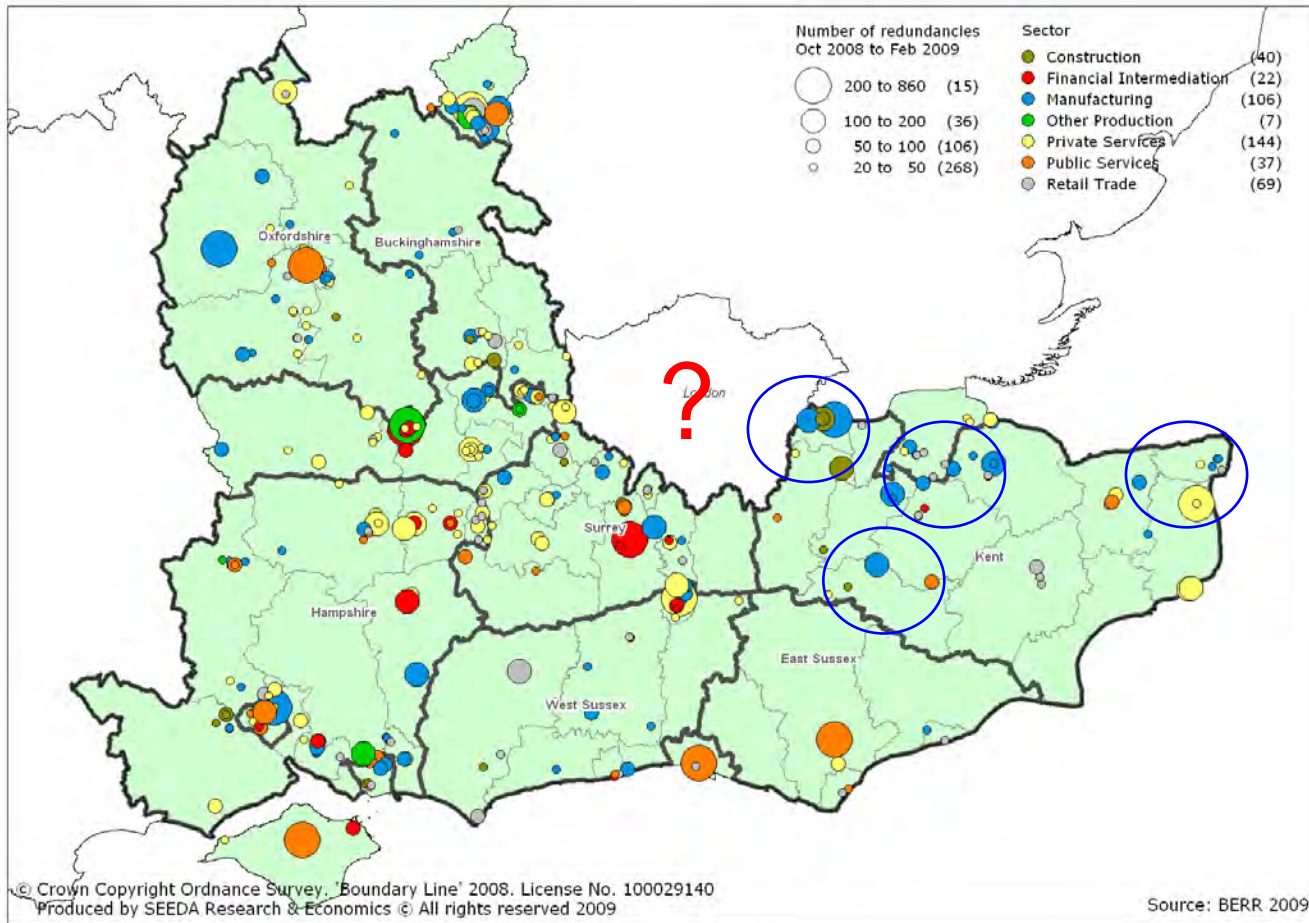
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Manufacturing harder hit than services

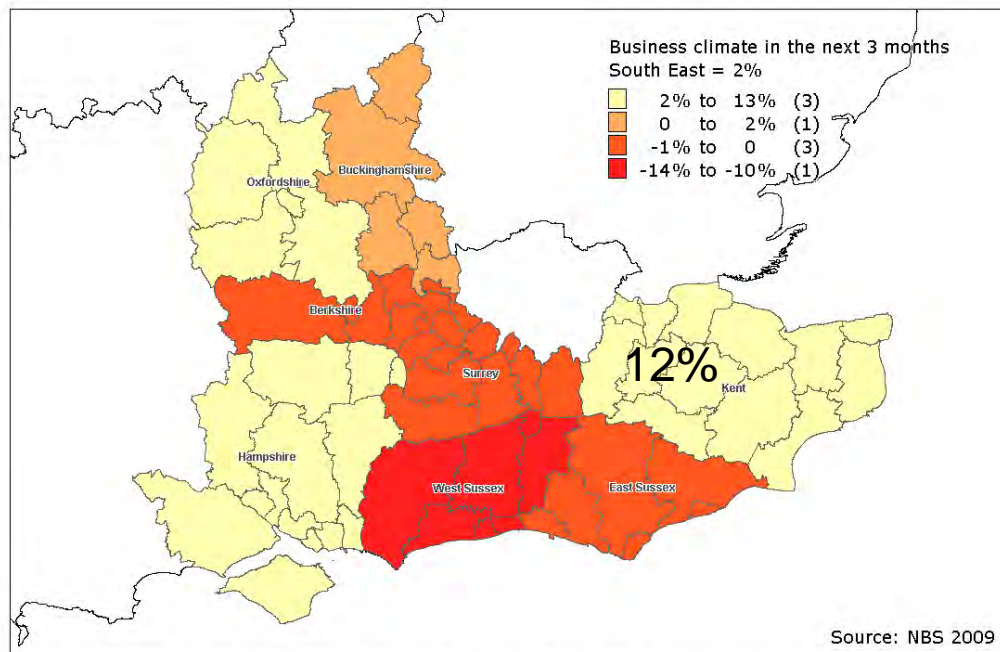

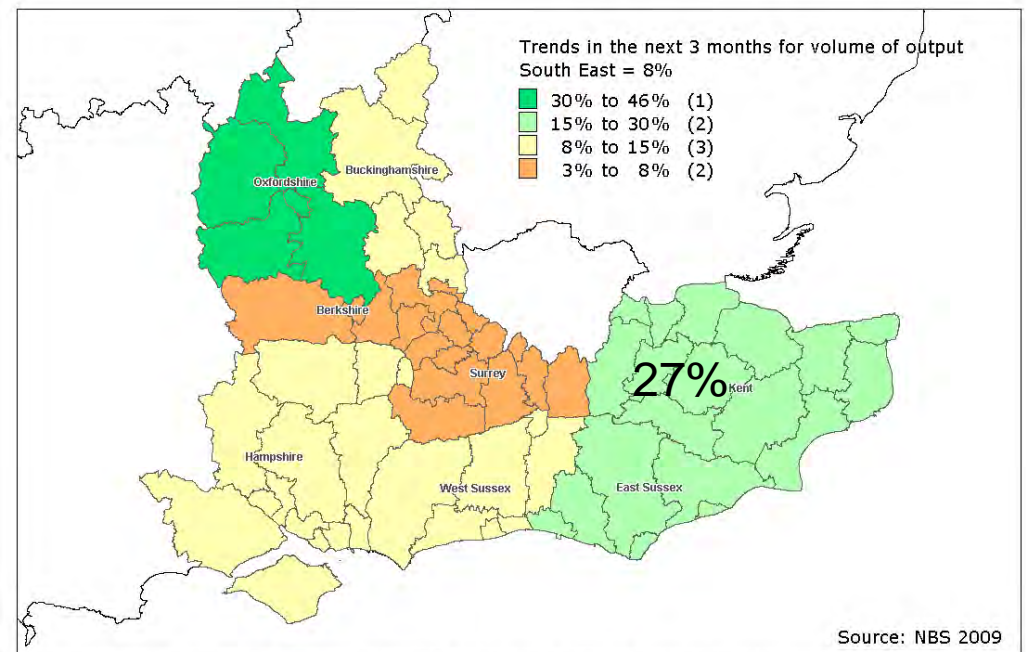
Business in Kent more optimistic than elsewhere

... expected trends for the next 3 months, with regard to Volume of Output (net balance)



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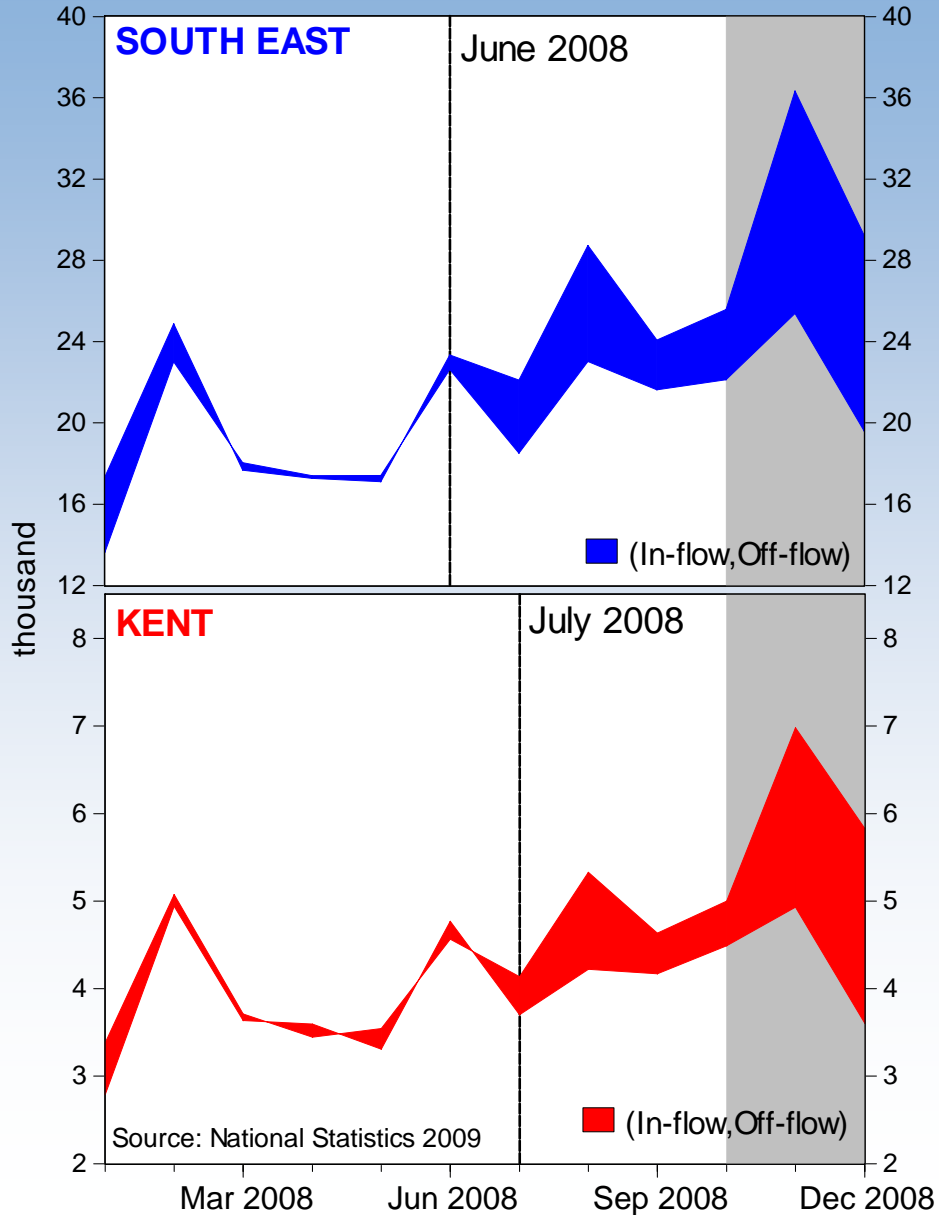
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Key Challenges

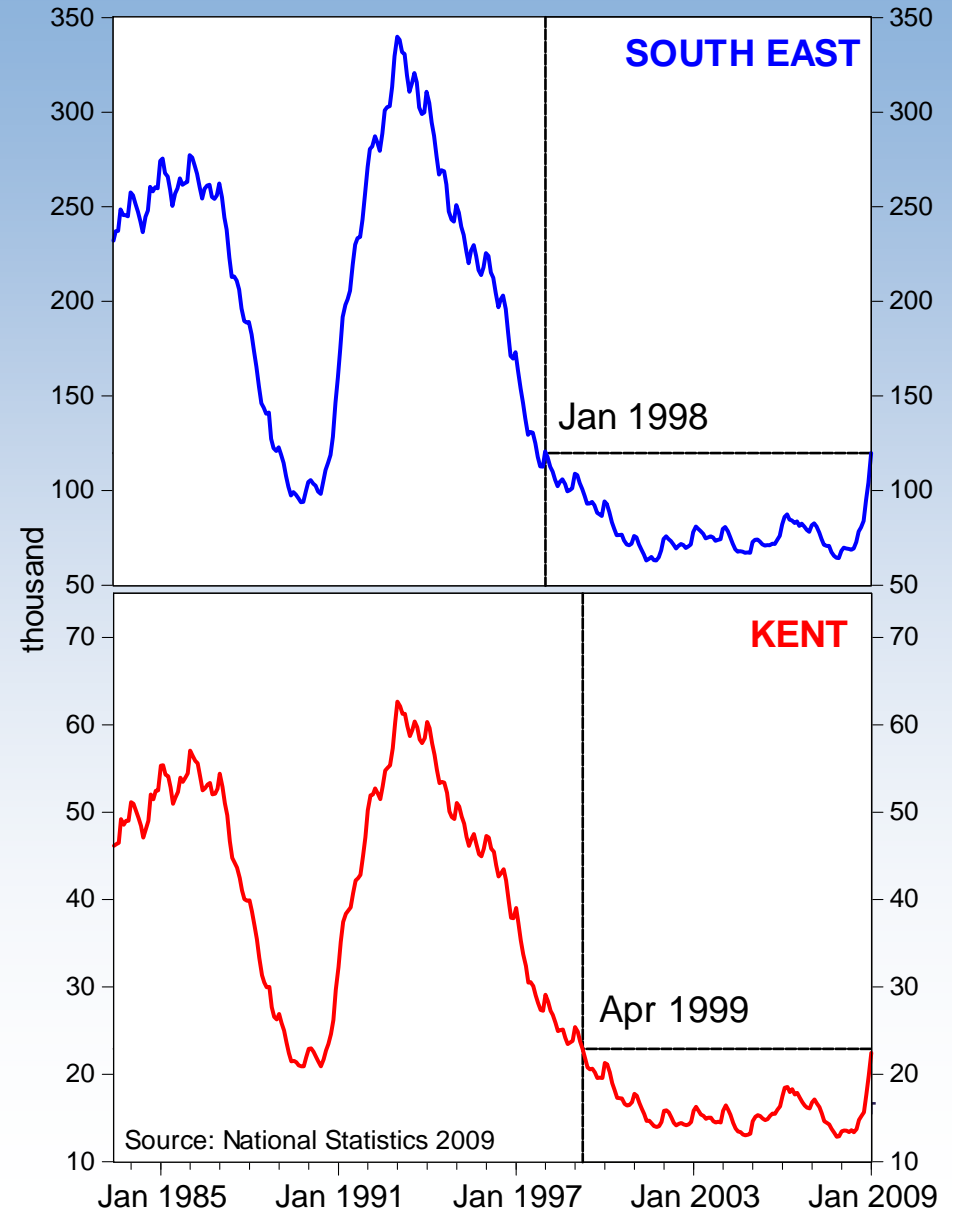
- **Cost of credit insurance** increased for 52% of small businesses in the South East. *Source: FSB Feb'08*
- Some **credit insurers** now refusing to insure some businesses. Concern about the ability of companies in **supply chain** to withstand recession. *Source: SEEDA 2009, Regional Intelligence Snapshot for the South East*
- 2/3 of small businesses in South East have seen an increase in the overall cost of new credit in the past 2 months. *Source: FSB Feb'08*
- **Liquidity – scarcity of money is an issue.**

Claimant Flows

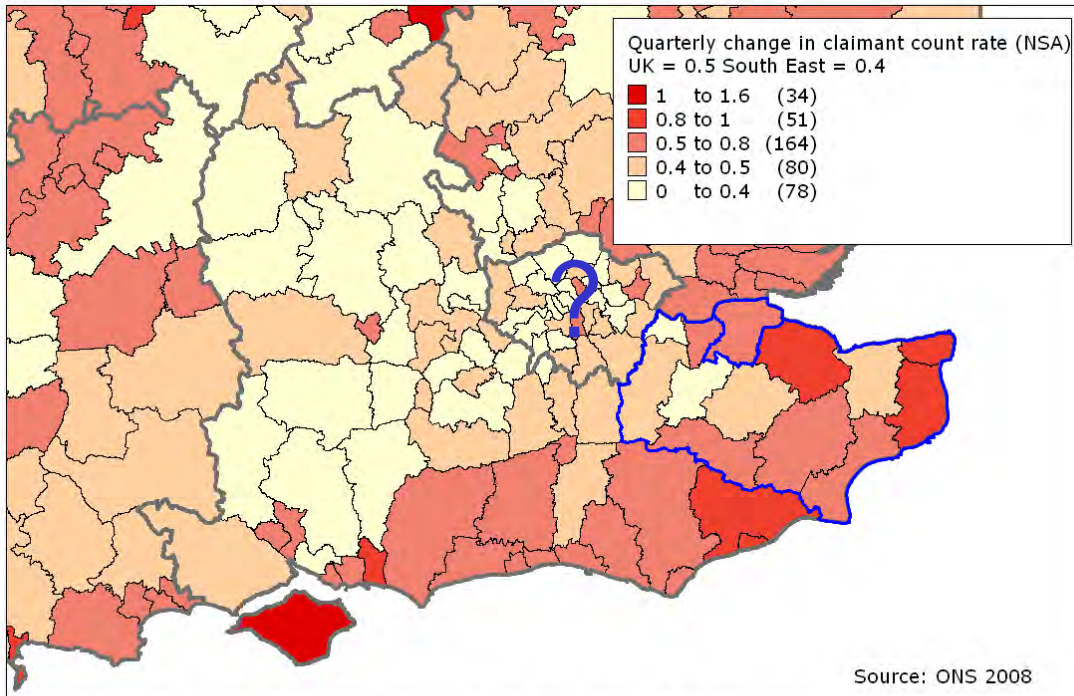


Claimant Count Unemployment

Possible impact on public services

- Increase in demand for public services
 - Housing and council tax benefit
 - Social services
 - Children services
 - Health
 - Education services
 - Policing
 - Advice (CAB), etc.
- Private providers withdrawing from the market?
 - Private schools
 - Private social-care providers
- Regeneration programme failure?

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Possible impact on public services

- Increase in demand against falling incomes
 - Council tax
 - Business rates
 - Development (S106)
 - Parking fees
 - Income from investment
 - Lower public sector spending etc.
- Could impact on provision in some areas?
- Increased redundancies in local authorities?
